Well, its already time for our first annual garden tour and our talented committee has lined up some wonderful gardens for us to visit. This very special tour is for Mid-South Hydrangea Society members (and guests) only, and is one of the benefits of membership. We've had a good winter and spring for optimum bloom, and even in my neglected garden, hydrangeas are showing the best bloom in a long time. I'm so excited about the new varieties, (I confess that some are still in pots on my driveway) such as the stunningly bright leaves of macrophylla 'Sun Goddess', the rosy 'Amethyst' quercifolia, the double-flowered 'Snowflake' quercifolia, and the tiny one-inch leaves of 'Pia Dwarf' mophead (surely this will grow larger.) I'm also mourning the loss of some new varieties for me, such as 'White Moth' paniculata, macrophylla 'Frillibet', and others that didn't make it through my winter neglect. But the gardens we will be visiting on our tour have many old and new hydrangeas, and I can't wait to get out and see you all there.

Several of our members are looking forward to attending the second Hydrangea Conference at the CANR (Center for Applied Nursery Research) in Thomson, GA on May 19-21 and we will give you a review at the October meeting, along with a year-end review of our first year as a society. Don't forget, we will have a regular meeting on October 10, in addition to our special speaker on Saturday, October 22. And get started propagating some cuttings of your hydrangeas to bring to our plant raffles.



I've had a great time so far this first year of our society, and we're just getting started! See you at the tour on June 4.

All Mid-south Hydrangea Society members and their guests are invited to participate in this special event. We are delighted to present two city and two country gardens for your viewing.

Note that this is a progressive garden tour — the gardens will only be open at the times indicated. The tour will begin at Anne Riordan’s garden, then move as a group to the next garden, and so on. Due to limited parking, car-pooling with other members is encouraged. Maps and instructions for parking are given for each garden below.

Originally the parsonage for the nearby Mullins Methodist Church, the gardens surrounding this 1/3 acre site are fashioned in the English style. Included in the garden rooms and borders are 18 varieties of mophead, lacecap, oakleaf, paniculata, and climbing hydrangea.


Parking is available on Mendenhall Place, just south of Anne’s house.



10:00 AM Country Garden of Walter Dunn
144 Rocky Point Rd Cordova, TN 38018

Surrounded by the rapidly expanding suburb of Cordova, this 16 acre private retreat features long vistas and huge specimens of hydrangea. Special highlights include a hosta trail surrounding the house and an enchanted woodland water garden.

- * From Anne’s house go South on N. Mendenhall toward Walnut Grove.
- * Turn left on Walnut Grove and go 8.9 miles, then turn left onto E. Rocky Point Rd.
- * Walter’s house is .2 miles on the right.
- * Due to special parking arrangements, it’s important that everyone caravan to Walter’s house.

This 1/3 acre casual cottage garden is owned by a true plant collector and includes 40 varieties each of hosta, clematis, and hydrangea. Special features include a hydrangea walk that leads to the garden entry, colorful borders, and a charming shade garden.

- * Travel east on Walnut Grove to Houston Levee.
- * Turn left on Houston Levee to Hwy. 64 (you'll pass Macon).
- * Turn left on Hwy. 64, then turn left on Davies Plantation
- * Cedar Glen is the 4th street on the right.

- * Turn left on Davies Plantation to Hwy. 64.
- * Turn right on Hwy. 64 to Canada Rd. (Note: Houston Levee changes to Canada Rd. at this intersection).
- * Turn left on Canada Rd. and go to I-40.
- * Enter I-40 towards Nashville to Exit 25 – stay to the right.
- * Exit right onto Airline Rd. (Hwy. 205).
- * Quickly on the left is a sign to the Visitors Center. **Park there to carpool to Gardens Oy Vey. (see on ★ map)**
